

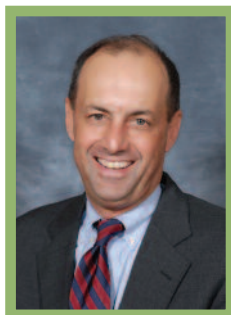

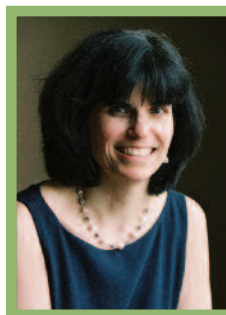

KEYNOTE SPEAKER:

Christopher J. Daggett

Chris currently is the President and CEO of the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation. He served as Deputy Chief of Staff to the Governor of New Jersey from 1982-1983, Cabinet Secretary to the Governor from 1983-1984, Regional Administrator of the USEPA from 1984-1988, and Commissioner of the NJDEP from 1988-1989. After leaving public service at the end of 1989, Mr. Daggett became a managing director at William E. Simon & Sons, an investment firm in Morristown. In 1996, he started his own firm dedicated to buying, remediating and redeveloping contaminated properties, and from 2004-2010, he also served as a principal at J.M. Sorge, Inc., an environmental consulting and management firm. In 2009, Mr. Daggett ran for governor of New Jersey as an independent candidate. Since entering the private sector in 1990, Mr. Daggett has also served on numerous non-profit boards, mostly in the areas of education, the environment and land use planning. Mr. Daggett earned his undergraduate degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a Doctorate in Education from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.

Douglas W. Schoenberger

Doug is Vice President of Corporate Responsibility and Public Policy for Verizon New Jersey. In this role, Doug manages Verizon NJ's philanthropic activities in the state, focusing on programs that support education and literacy, domestic violence prevention, and internet safety. He oversees statewide programs that reflect Verizon NJ's responsibilities as one of the state's largest corporate citizens. Doug also addresses broadband and technology policy issues.

Prior to joining Verizon in 2007, Doug held several positions with AT&T. Most recently, Doug was based in Washington DC where he advocated AT&T's positions on international service issues. Previously, he represented AT&T in state, federal, and international arenas on technology, standards, and infrastructure topics. He first joined AT&T with Bell Laboratories, where he had a number of assignments including PBX engineering and technical regulatory analysis.

Doug is a board member of The Salvation Army-NJ Division, Leadership New Jersey, the New Jersey Technology Council and Einstein's Alley. He is a past board member of the US Telecommunications Training Institute, the Coalition of Service Industries, and the US ITU Association.

Doug has a B.S. in Applied Mathematics from Union College and an M.Eng. in Operations Research from Cornell University.

Lois W. Greco

Lois is Wachovia Senior Vice President and Wachovia Regional Foundation & CDC Evaluation Officer. Since taking this position in 2001, Lois has managed the Foundation's portfolio of performance-based grants with an approximate award value of \$55 million. Lois joined Wachovia in 1994 and has served in various training and management roles in the commercial bank. Prior to joining Wachovia, she served as Goodwill Industry of Eastern North Carolina's first Director of Development. She began her career in banking in 1988 at Chemical Bank (Chase) in New York in the bank's specialized commercial banking group, the Not-For-Profit Group.

Lois serves as the State Coordinator of Wachovia's Reading First program for the Pennsylvania and Delaware regions, and also serves as the local Reading First coordinator in two elementary schools. She is on the board of the Council of New Jersey Grantmakers, and is active in her community's local school association. Lois earned a BA with Highest Honors in economics from Rutgers College.

Sidney Hargro

Sidney's twelve-year career in philanthropy has produced a record of success in community leadership, organizational strategy and performance, and strategic grantmaking. It was just one year ago that Sidney began his tenure as the first Executive Director of the Community Foundation of South Jersey (CFSJ), which serves an eight county region. Sidney's goals are to build and implement a foundation strategy that embraces the foundations three roles of giving advisor, grant investor, and community leader.

Sidney came to the foundation from The Columbus Foundation in Columbus, Ohio where he was the Senior Officer of Strategy and Organizational Learning. He managed activities in cross-departmental innovation strategy; business strategy and organizational learning activities; as well as social impact evaluation.

As a community leader, Sidney has actively participated on a myriad of boards and committees. He continues to participate on national philanthropic advisory committees, conference committees, and as a contributing blogger with the Council on Foundations.
